THE ESTATE is about 1 mile from the Town of Princes Risborough and 11/2 miles from the Junction Station of the Great Western Railway, from whence the capital Market Towns of Aylesbury and High Wycombe are reached by rail in a few minutes, being about 8 miles by road from each Town; the City of Oxford in 50 minutes, and on the near completion of the New Line or the Great Central and Great Western Joint Committee now in course of active construction, it is anticipated to reach the Metropolis in 40 minutes or less;

forming a most complete and desirable Residential Estate, occupying a unique position in this Historic County,
